7 tricks for better photos of your dog.

LOVE, MADE VISIBLE

FROM THE STUDIO

The best photos are not about perfect dogs.

They are about a familiar look: the head tilt, the skeptical side-eye, the giant grin that appears when you say the right word. You do not need fancy equipment to catch it.

Use these seven tricks when you have your phone nearby. Keep it light, keep it playful, and take more photos than you think you need.

01

Find soft window light

Stand near a large window or step into open shade outside. Soft light gives your dog's eyes sparkle without harsh shadows.

02

Get down to their level

Kneel, sit, or lie on the floor. A camera at eye level feels more personal and lets their expression do the talking.

03

Clear the background

Take one step sideways or move the laundry basket. A simple background keeps the whole frame focused on the star.

04

Use a sound, not a command

A quiet squeak, a kissy noise, or the word "treat" can create a curious expression. Save it for when your phone is ready.

KEEP GOING

Let the personality lead.

05

Tap to focus on the eyes

On most phones, tap your dog's nearest eye before taking the photo. Sharp eyes are the fastest way to make a portrait feel alive.

06

Use burst mode

Dogs move faster than our thumbs. Hold the shutter down during a happy moment, then choose the one frame where everything clicks.

07

Photograph the in-between

Do not wait for a perfect sit. The yawn, the ear flop, the post-walk nap—those are often the photos you keep forever.

BONUS

Take breaks

A two-minute play break can reset everyone's mood. Great dog photos come from comfort, not pressure.



ONE LAST THING

Chase the feeling, not perfection.

The photo that means the most is rarely the most polished one. It is the one that looks like *your* dog.
